London Borough of Tower Hamlets (LBTH) Development Officers attended the AGM and updated us on the proposed development in Wickford Street. We also heard from the Tower Hamlets Homes ASB Manager and the ASB Officer who is responsible for Category 1 cases (drug related ASB). Unfortunately, during the summer months we have seen an increase in drug related ASB and there has been a number of stabbing in and around the Bancroft Estate. If you witness any such activity please report this to the Police and the ASB team as detailed below so that the incident is recorded in order for appropriate services to be deployed in the area. Along with the proposed development in Wickford Street, we have been told that Tower Hamlets Community Housing now plan to begin work on the site by the railway arches in Mantus Road next year. The TMC will be pressing for further information on the planned landscaping work to our green and the offer to contribute financially towards a play area upgrade.

We are delighted to see that the introduction of gallows gate on either side of the green has seen a reduction in both ASB & fly tipping. We look forward to the upgrading of the lamp posts which should act as a further deterrent against this type of poor behaviour. You will have seen we have added bike shelters in Hadleigh & Wickford House areas and hope to have an extra one installed shortly in Bancroft House. Spaces are limited so if you are interested please contact the TMC Office.

Finally, this time of year is traditionally a time when fireworks are used and we cannot stress highly enough the importance of being mindful of health & safety. Should you witness anyone misusing fireworks in the communal area of the estate please report this both to the Police and the TMC Office.
